CALL FOR POSTERS

In keeping with the IPPS motto of "To Seek and To Share", the Western North America Region of the International Plant Propagators' Society is seeking posters to be shared at the 2023 Annual Conference in Portland, Oregon on January 24-28, 2023. This event will bring together educators, researchers, professionals, and students in the fields of plant propagation, plant production, and related disciplines. All participants in the conference are welcome to submit posters and all accepted posters will be published in the conference proceedings.

General Poster Submission

Any research, development, or horticultural practice related to plant propagation, production, or science is appropriate for submission as a poster, as long as it is non-commercial in nature. Posters do not have to be academic or scientific in nature! If you have an innovative technique or method for growing plants, feel free to share it through a poster. Posters do not have to be limited to plant propagation. Membership in IPPS is not required.

Final hard-copy posters should be vertically formatted and be up to 35-inches wide by 47-inches tall. General directions on how to develop a poster can be found at these websites:

Specific requirements for posters include:

- The poster title, author, and affiliation should be on the top of the poster.
- Lettering for the title should be at least 1-inch tall, other text may be smaller, but should be legible from two feet away.
- Authors are encouraged to include a personal photograph in the poster to assist in identification.
- Images, figures, and tables should predominate over text.

A one page summary or abstract of the poster's content should accompany the application. Acceptance of the poster for presentation will be based on a review of the summary. If accepted, the summary will be published in the 2023 Combined Proceedings. Published articles are fully copyright protected. A digital copy of the poster can also be archived. Please include the author's name(s), affiliation, address, phone number and email address on the summary. Accepted posters should be brought to the Wilsonville, Oregon Holiday Inn by 5:00 pm Tuesday, January 24, 2023. They will be removed by 12:00 noon, Friday, January 27 and should be picked up at that time. Please submit the application and summary by December 10, 2022. You will be contacted if your poster is selected for display.

Student Research Poster Competition Submission

This year's student research poster competition will be simplified. The contest is open to graduate and undergraduate students enrolled in any higher education institution. The only requirement is that posters describe the student's research in some aspect of horticultural crop production or plant science. All accepted posters will be displayed at the meeting and included in the proceedings. Winning posters will be awarded \$300, \$200, or \$100 for first, second, and third place winners, respectively.

Rules for the poster competition are as follows:

1. A digital pdf copy of the completed poster and an abstract must be submitted by December 10, 2022 to Larry Rupp.
2. A panel of judges from the IPPS-WNR Board of Directors will judge the posters during the conference.

All students interested in attending the conference are eligible to apply for a Bruce Briggs Scholarship, regardless of whether or not they are presenting a poster. Winners of the Briggs Scholarship will have their registration fee waived and be provided shared lodging with other scholarship winners. Applications for the scholarship are due October 15, 2022 (please see <https://wna.ipps.org/news-article/article-483/BRUCE-BRIGGS-MEMORIAL-SCHOLARSHIP-2023.html>). This year's conference promises to be a great opportunity for students and professionals alike. It is highlighted by an exciting program of tours and presentations by some of the greatest nurserymen and nurseries in the Northwest.
